INTRODUCTION TO CAPSTONE

The Capstone is the culmination of all your hard work in the instructional design program. It is designed to prepare you to enter the workforce as an instructional designer. In this final course, you will design and develop a unique project which reflects the skills and knowledge you have gained throughout the program. This project will be a digital educational resource of your choosing.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

By the completion of this course, you will be able to demonstrate core knowledge of:

- The instructional design process, a systematic approach to applying what we know about how people learn to the design of educational materials
- Theories of teaching and learning
- Principles of the design of digital media for instruction

COURSE FORMAT

This is a fully online course which will run for 14 weeks. Within those weeks, you will be directed to complete activities by due dates.

CAPSTONE REQUIREMENTS

- Final preparation of your ePortfolio
- Completion of a project management plan
- Design and development of your Capstone Project
- Live presentation of your Capstone Project

EXPECTATIONS

As you are completing the Capstone experience, it is expected that you will put 7-10 hours of work into the course per week. This will require an incredible amount of focus and attention to timeliness in order to complete the required work. Please be mindful of the expected workload.

Learning Strategies

Peer Discussion

Throughout the course you will engage with your peers in academic discussions. These discussions are designed to promote the sharing of ideas and the asking of questions to help you refine your Capstone project and your ePortfolio. Discussion prompts will be provided throughout to encourage you to engage in discourse and seek feedback from your peers.

Video Progress Reports

You will be required to submit brief video check-ins, detailing your progress on your work in this Capstone Experience. You will review the video progress reports of your peers and offer assistance and support where appropriate. You are expected to submit check-ins on time. Late check-ins will not be counted.

Professor Feedback

Throughout the Capstone Experience you will receive focused attention from the instructor, who will work with you individually to help you make progress on your project. The instructor will provide feedback on areas where you need further

development to meet the intended outcomes of the program. The goal of the feedback is to prepare you to enter a career path as a professional instructional designer.

Peer Critique

Throughout the course you will have the opportunity to review and critique the ideas and work of your peers. It is imperative that you use respectful language and tones during these peer critiques, and that you offer both positive and negative details to inform the improvement of your peers' work. You must also practice the art of tactfully receiving feedback, which we have reviewed throughout the program.

Participation Guidelines

Checking Email

You are required to access your Quinnipiac email account regularly throughout this course. It will be the primary form of communication used by your professor. You are encouraged to check your email once a day, or at the very least every other day.

Communicating with the Instructor

I will respond to email within 24 hours of receipt. If you have a question that would be relevant to your peers, post it to the Help Forum on the Discussion Board. Assignments will be graded with feedback within 5 days of receipt. All assignment grades and feedback will be posted to the Grade Center. There may be a delay in feedback and grading on assignments submitted beyond the deadline. Individual meetings are available on request.
